This is the third community plan since the first was presented in 2008, with information being collected from a workshop in 2017 with Peter Kenyon from Bank of I.D.E.A.S; the 2018 Cromwell Masterplan Survey; and a 2019 community brainstorming session with Cissy Rock from Community Think Ltd and the Connect Cromwell Post-COVID snap poll.

# COMMUNITIES THAT PROTECT, CELEBRATE AND ENHANCE THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT AND LAID-BACK LIFESTYLE

We value our rural, laidback lifestyle and our clean, beautiful, diverse natural environment/landscape, including the lake, our wide-openspaces, the mountains and hills and the vineyards and or chards in the area.

The Cromwell District's natural environment is the backbone of the economic, social and cultural well-being of our town. Our environment provides resources, opportunities and benefits.

Our engagement and connection as kaitiaki are paramount for the protection and enhancement of the environment, to create a sustainable future for generations to come.

## Protect, maintain and enhance Lake Dunstan

The community value Lake Dunstan for both the aesthetic value and recreational activities it offers. They are concerned that the lake is an underutilized and neglected asset.

Enhancing and protecting our diverse flora, fauna and ecology has been identified as critical to retaining our unique place in this world. A solid plan is needed to identify issues and maximise the potential of the lake and foreshore. The Guardians of the Lake (GOLD) are the local environmental conservation group advocating to protect and enhance Lake Dunstan now and for future generations. They are taking the lead in the planning and development of a Lake Management Plan.

# Encourage responsible urban planning

Our community strongly values our access to the special natural environment of car Cromwell District, and want to ensure that any development in the area is sympathetic to the natural landscape.

This includes maintaining and incorporating the network of greenway walkways into any new subdivisions.

#### Reduce our pollution

As a community we recognise a need to reduce the amount of solid and liquid waste we produce as households and businesses, and the importance of reducing the quantity of waste going to landfill.



# COMMUNITIES THAT BUILD ON AND CELEBRATE ARTS, CULTURE AND HERITAGE

Culture is a vital part of a healthy and connected community. Our creative and performing arts and heritage events are well supported by both locals and visitors.

The Cromwell Heritage Precinct is a key focal area for Cromwell's heritage. Building on this and celebrating the area is a key priority for the community, as is the Cromwell Museum. The Goldfields Mining Centre in the Kawarau Gorge provides an interactive experience of Cromwell's mining and Chinese heritage. Plans exist and some community interest for the future recreation of the Chinese section of the Old Cromwell Town.

## Support the development of an arts and culture centre for Cromwell

Community feedback shows that our community are keen for a place to hold events, performances, and art exhibitions. A local community group, the Cromwell Cultural Centre Trust, is currently investigating the feasibility of a multi-functional facility, and the Cromwell Heritage Precinct is seen as a desirable location for this.

#### Celebrate our heritage stories

The Cromwell District has a strong heritage due to its mining, horticulture, agriculture, viticulture and dam construction history.

#### Acknowledge our local artisans

Our special location stimulates the creative talents in a plethora of artists. There are opportunities to bring their products to greater prominence.



# SAFE AND HEALTHY COMMUNITIES WITH GOOD ACCESS TO SERVICES, AMENITIES AND FACILITIES

The communities value having safe and healthy environments and that we have good access to services, amenities and facilities.

In recent surveys, the community have said that they love that Cromwell is a safe community with good access to services, facilities and amenities in the area.

They enjoy quality education from early childhood to tertiary. The Central campus of the Otago Polytech is a strong asset to the community. As the town has grown significantly in the previous 10 years so too has the range of medical practitioners readily available. 
#### Health services meet current needs





**District Employment** Growth




**National Employment** Growth





Over the 2012 to 2019 period, the rate of population growth in Cromwell was the highest growth area in Central Otago. The highest rate of growth occurred in 2018 with a growth rate of 8.5%.
